



POLICY TITLE:	Parental Engagement
DEPARTMENT:	Academics

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Purpose

The purpose of this Parental Engagement Policy is to establish a framework that promotes active and meaningful participation of parents in the educational journey of their children at Al Ain Juniors School. This policy is based on the **School Policy on Parental Engagement** issued by the Abu Dhabi Department of Education and Knowledge (ADEK). Al Ain Juniors School, as a K-12 institution affiliated with both the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) and Cambridge International Examinations, recognizes the significant role that parents play in supporting academic achievement, social development, and the overall well-being of students.

Scope

This policy applies to all parents, guardians, and caregivers of students enrolled at Al Ain Juniors School. It covers the channels, initiatives, and expectations for parent-school collaboration and sets the foundation for effective communication and involvement in school activities.

Objectives

- To foster a strong partnership between parents and the school for the benefit of the students.
- To ensure open, transparent, and effective communication between the school and parents.
- To involve parents in the decision-making processes that affect their children's learning and development.
- To support parents in their roles as primary educators by providing opportunities for involvement in school life.

Parental Involvement in School Activities:

Regular Communication

The school will maintain open lines of communication with parents through multiple platforms, such as:
